

Just Google Tinder and Grinder dating safety, and you will see the issues with such apps. There are predators and dangerous people everywhere, you can come across them in everyday situations, they could work with you....but to put yourself on an app where you are willing to exchange mobile numbers, meet and go back to either a hotel room or their residence, you are opening yourself up to being alone with someone who knows you are not doing your homework on what the guy is really like. IF he is dangerous or has the potential to be, the female will not learn this in a matter of a few hours over cocktails, he will be slick, convincing and very plausible, predators are. - 1. Keep your friends and family in the loop of who and where you're meeting, get them call you if need be, one in. ...Never, get in anyone's car, arrive and leave alone.
- 2. Any gut feeling something is not right, it's usually accurate, we have a built in radar system to sense when we might be in danger, don't ignore it.
- 3. Meet in a safe, open, very public place. Never leave your food or drink unattended, take it with you to the ladies, if he comments, tough, let this be a warning, as everyone is aware of the dangers of drinks being spiked, and so should your date.
- 4. Limit alcohol consumption, full stop. This is just a first meeting to see if you have some chemistry and common ground, you are NOT actually dating, even if you have communicated for weeks online or via text You do NOT know this person.

- 8. Never let anyone send you nude images, body part images at anytime, but even more so when you have not established a long standing relationship and you know and feel safe with the person.
- 9. If you're genuinely looking for a relationship that could lead to something meaningful, then take your time to meet and get know your date. Never be pressurized into having sex early, never be coerced into sex by your date saying they expect to have sex by the third date at least. NO!
- 10. NEVER EVER HAVE SEX WITH ANYONE WITHIN A FEW HOURS OF MEETING!
